Name of Program/Activity (e.g., Program A) Delivery of Food Assistance to Affected Community due to COVID ECQ in compliance to Memorandum dated 27 March 2020 of Mines and Geosciences Bureau -

The primary objective of the food assistance program is to help sustain low-income families cope with their basic needs for food for lack of income due to the government-imposed Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ)/Lock down, and food sustenance to front liners manning the check points.

The unspent amount of the Social Development Management Program (SDMP) in 2019 of mining permit holders has been re-aligned for the purpose of implementing food assistance to all affected Communities, PWD/Senior Citizen in the localities where they are operating a mining project. This Is expanded to include the unspent CDP of the mining companies during their exploration period. Delivery of food assistance/cash aid is being coordinated with the local barangay officials and heads of PNP/Army detachment/units.

Issues Encountered*

1. As of this week, there are 13 out of 20 permit holders responded, mobilized and implemented their realigned SDMP to give food assistance to affected communities in their localities. UPMC/Vulcan with unspent CDP has mobilized and implemented its realigned CDP. As of this writing, out of the realigned budget of Php 4.464 Million, only 72.9% had been spent equivalent to Php 3.255 Million benefiting 6,683 low-income Households and 571 front liners, mostly manning the checkpoints.
2. The permit holders of LGUs of the six (6) provinces have not submitted their reports although there were twelve (12) of them who submitted their schedules of realigned SDMPs, 5 from Negros Occidental, 8 from Antique, 1 from Iloilo and 3 from Aklan.
3. Until now, we are still following up the compliances of other seven (7) permit holders encouraging and imploring them to participate in this noble initiative to help those who are now suffering from this extended ECQ. In case, there are companies who have not Implemented 100% financial compliance, what will happen to the realigned SDMP budget?
4. There is an inquiry whether the budget for assistance (cash aid/food supplies) can also be given to their employees who have been out of work due to suspended operation. These employees are residents of their localities. This issue has not been answered by MGB-CO.
5. Will the period of implementation of the assistance under the realigned SDMP can be extended beyond May 2020 or after the extended period of ECQ considering that some permit holders have no staff because of the suspension of work and strict implementation of ECQ in their locality wherein movement has been restricted.
