Aklan is a province located in the northwest portion of Panay Island, bordered by the provinces of Iloilo from the south, Capiz from the east and Antique from the southwest. It also faces the Sibuyan and includes the island of Boracay which is located at its northwestern tip.

The province is composed of 17 municipalities with 327 barangays.

II. LAND AREA AND MINERAL POTENTIAL

Total land area of the province of Aklan is 181,789 hectares. The total area covered by the approved mining rights is only **0.67% or 1,217.529** hectares of the total land area of Aklan.

In the case of Sand and gravel mining, a total of 130 employees were recorded. Most of them 103 (79.23%) are male while only 27 (20.77%) are female engaged in this kind of industry.
